## Services Offered

**CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAMS** Offered each semester on topics including personal safety awareness and security

**MOTOR VEHICLE ASSISTANCE** Jump-starting batteries, retrieving keys locked in vehicles, and providing phone access for emergency situations

**GC ALERT** Emergency Notification through Voicemail, Email, and Text Messaging for rapid emergency notification

**SECURITY ESCORTS** Provided by the Security Officers on campus at any time upon request

**OPERATION ID** Marking expensive personal items with an ID number to deter theft and allow tracking if theft occur.

LOST & FOUND Items may be retrieved during business hours

**DID YOU FORGET?** Courtesy reminder left on doors found unlocked and unattended to remind students to close and lock doors and windows when leaving their rooms

## Campus Safety Tips!

### Residence Hall Crime Deterrence

ALWAYS lock your door, even if you are only going to be away for a short time.

**NEVER** prop open an exterior door.

**NEVER** leave valuables (small or large) unattended.

**REGISTER** your personal items with Campus Safety via Operation ID.

**REPORT** illegal or suspicious people or situations immediately! Get to know your neighbors and call 336-312-9911 if something just doesn't seem right.

## Vehicle Crime Deterrence

ALWAYS roll up vehicle windows and lock doors

**ALWAYS** secure valuable items such as purses, books, book bags, phones, computers, and other valuables in the trunk, console, or glove compartment.

**NEVER** leave your unattended vehicle running.

#### **Additional Crime Deterrence**

**REPORT** any suspicious activity immediately to the Campus Safety & Security Department at 336-312-9911 (Emergency) or 336-217-7245 (Office).

**REMEMBER** it is safer to travel in pairs and on well-lit paths and roads during the evening hours.

**REPORT** burned-out lights, broken windows, doors, locks, and any other security related problems immediately to Residence Life, Maintenance, or Public Safety.

**NEVER** leave your book bag, wallet, purse, computer, or keys unattended - especially in public places.

**NEVER** walk or jog alone at night.

**AVOID** wearing headphones or ear buds while you are walking or exercising alone outside.

A common theme of all awareness and crime prevention programs is to encourage students and employees to be aware of their responsibility for their own security and the security of others.
